The Heroes of Savannah School was built with a flat cement roof, so that it could be expanded into a two-story building as additional classrooms were needed. (See the picture below.) The authorities in Haiti have determined that such buildings cannot be used for schools. So, even though the Heroes of Savannah School building seemed undamaged by the earthquake, we cannot reopen using the existing classrooms. We must to put up a “temporary structure” like the one erected at Marechal.

The “temporary structure” at Marechal is working well, but when it rains (as it has started to do), we need another temporary building for the kindergarten.

Pastor Anilus has gotten estimates for putting up a temporary structure at Heroes of Savannah School and a second temporary structure at Marechal for the kindergarten class and we have sent him the money (approximately \$1,800) to start the work.

As soon as the temporary structure at Heroes of Savannah School is complete, the school will re-open.

According to Pastor Anilus, schools will close in August this year.

We will send along pictures of the new buildings and of the children in their classes as they come to us.
